**Crime Prevention**

Organize a Neighborhood Watch Group. Clean up your block, remove graffiti, trim the trees, improve lighting, and identify crime and quality of life issues. Utilize City resources to improve the quality of life for your family and your community, become part of the problem solving process.

Once you start any type of group, keep it simple. Work on a small area (one block as opposed to five blocks) and focus on small quality of life issues. Develop close working relationship with your Senior Lead Officer and with other City personnel assigned to your area. Schedule meetings for Saturdays possibly between 10 am and 12 pm. Meetings during the week are difficult for most citizens to attend due to work, traffic and family responsibilities. Also, schedule training for your group and organize clean ups for your block. Clean-ups are simple and go a long way; most citizens underestimate the value of clean-ups. Last- Consider a camera system for your neighborhood
