- a. **Motion:** The Arts & Culture Committee moves to approve an NPG for up to \$2,200 to Rogue Artists Ensemble to support 3 free community performances of their touring outreach and education multi-media performance, *The Story of Frog Belly Rat Bone*, based on the book by Timothy Basil Ering to take place on the campus of Micheltorena Elementary School this fall. The program will be presented at no cost to the school and promotes literacy, performing and visual arts standards, in addition to an anti-bullying message for over 300 community members.
