If you are interested in filling the Region 5 vacancy (Region 5 map), are a "stakeholder" in Region 5, and are 14 years old or over, you are eligible to fill that vacancy. It is a volunteer, non-paying position. A person does not have to be a registered voter or a United States citizen to be a stakeholder. A person will be a SLNC Region 5 stakeholder if he or she "lives, works, or owns real property in the neighborhood" and also if she or he "declares a stake in the neighborhood as a community interest stakeholder, defined as a person who affirms a substantial and ongoing participation within the neighborhood boundaries and who may be in a community organization such as, but not limited to, educational, non-profit and/or religious' organizations. Please bring a candidate's statement of no more than 200 words and prepare a verbal presentation of no more than 3 minutes. Applicants must attend the Board Meeting and present their Stakeholder status - such as an ID and a utility bill or a pay stub, to show your connection to Region 5. This position is only open until the new Board is seated in June 2016. If you take the funding and ethics training online beforehand, you will be able to vote immediately once seated. Otherwise you can participate the first night but not vote. (10 min)

The entire board is precluded from hearing the matter. It is not sufficient for the board member with the child to simply recuse themselves from voting on the matter, the NPG will not be funded."
